2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture

Section 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin.

Drench the affected skin with running water for 10 minutes or longer if substance is still

on skin. Consult a doctor.

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Eye contact: Bathe the eye with running water for 15 minutes. Consult a doctor.

Ingestion: Wash out mouth with water. If conscious, give half a litre of water to drink immediately. If

unconscious and breathing is OK, place in the recovery position. Consult a doctor.

Inhalation: Remove casualty from exposure ensuring one's own safety whilst doing so. If

conscious, ensure the casualty sits or lies down. If unconscious and breathing is OK,

place in the recovery position. Consult a doctor.
