

9.1 USING THE ON/OFF SWITCH - FIG. 1 The first press of the on/off switch ① will operate the spot light. The second press will operate the low mode of the main light. The third press will operate the medium mode of the main light. The fourth press will operate the high mode of the main light. The fifth press will turn the light off.

Note: There is a memory function for the on/off switch. If you leave the head torch in one mode for 5 seconds, then switch it off, next time it is switched on, it will be in the mode last used.
