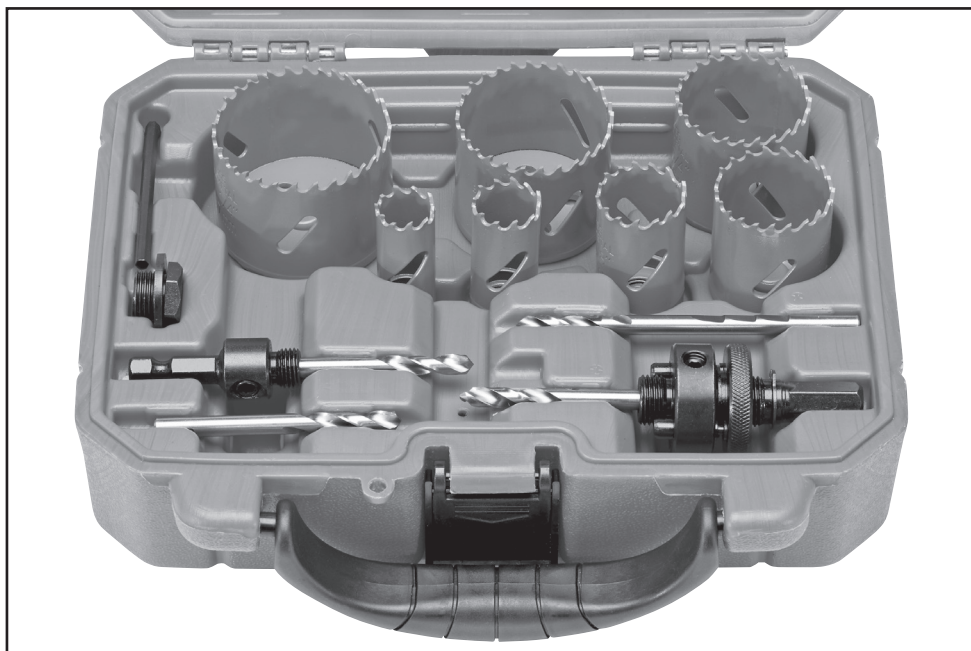

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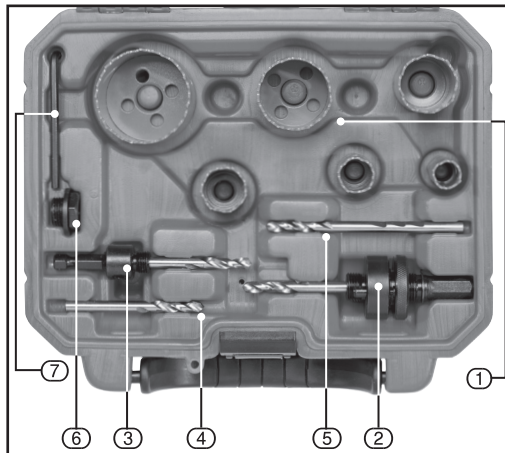

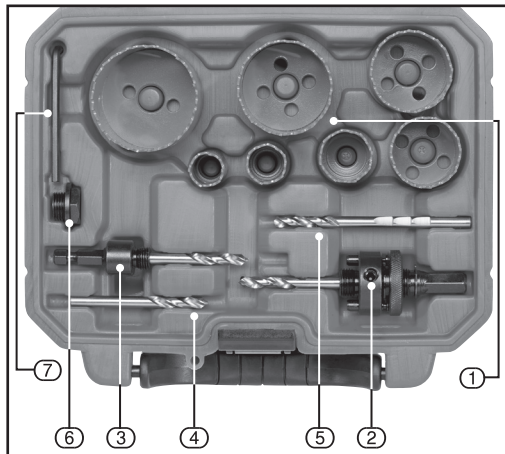

2.1 IDENTIFICATION (Stock No.99325)



- ① 6 x Hole saws: 16,20,25,32,40 and 51mm.
- ② Locking arbor.
- ③ Simple arbor.
- ④ Pilot drill.
- ⑤ Pilot drill.
- ⑥ Adaptor.
- ⑦ Hex. key.

- ① 7 x Hole saws: 19,22,29,38,44,51 and 57mm.
- ② Locking arbor.

3. HEALTH & SAFETY

3.1 GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR HOLE SAW USE

Ensure:

- To inspect the tool before every use – do not use if parts are loose or damaged.
- Operation at correct speed (see table).
- Application of sufficient pressure when cutting.
- To set pilot drill 3mm proud of saw teeth or drill pilot hole first with HSS 6.35mm (1/4”) drill.
- Use of a top grade lubricant suitable for the material being worked.
- Correct fitting in drill chuck and fully tighten.
- Horizontal and perpendicular use to workpiece.
- If possible, use of hole saw in bench drill or lathe for accuracy and safety.
- Correct arbor is securely fitted to blade before use. Drive pins where applicable must be fully engaged within the blade holes.
- To wear the appropriate and approved eye, hearing and breathing protection. Keep hands away from rotating parts.

Do not:

- Run power tool at faster than recommended speed. This reduces efficiency and wears the product out sooner.
- Allow teeth to rub on metal without exerting pressure. Rubbing will dull cutting edge.
- Set drill any longer than the thickness of workpiece to prevent damage to saw teeth and drill on breakthrough.
- Operate without a lubricant (except on cast iron) as this will generate excess heat and damage the blade.
- Operate offset or loose in chuck.
- Try to operate at an angle, as blade can distort or break.
- Allow drilling machine to wobble or stray during sawing.
- Saw with the blade loose as this can cause damage to both blade and arbor and possibly cause injury.
- Let loose hair or clothing get anywhere near the revolving parts.

Failure to observe the above points could result in tool failure and/or injury and could negate your rights.

4. SET UP & OPERATION

4.1 ASSEMBLING THE HOLE SAW

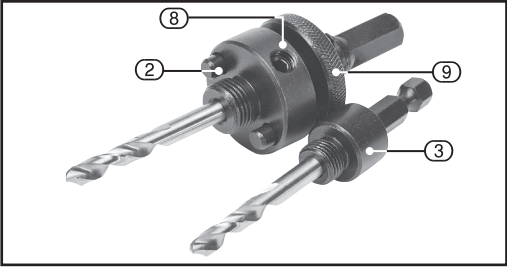
Simple arbor:

- Select the required size hole saw for the job in hand.

- Arbor (3) is for 14 – 30mm hole saws.
- Adaptor (6) connects to arbor (3) so that the arbor can take hole saws 32 – 152mm.

Locking arbor:

- The grub screw is for locking the arbor (2) onto the drill bit.
- To use, unscrew locking pins, fit hole saw, align holes with locking pins and re-tighten.
